Overview: The Summer Academy Teaching Artist is a 4 to 8 week contract, Monday-Friday 8:30am-4:30pm. For the Summer Theater Academy Lead Teaching Artist position you must believe in the mission of First Stage, to transform lives through theater, and work to create a safe, welcoming, inspiring, and motivating environment for students, teachers and parents. We are seeking a Lead Teaching Artist with expertise in Acting Theory (5-12 Grade).

Acting Theory introduces and develops the actor's core tools of body, voice, and imagination. Students explore physical storytelling, vocal dynamics, and creative play while learning to analyze text, build character, and make bold, purposeful choices. As skills progress, students deepen their ability to play honest, connected characters through active listening, clear objectives, and thoughtful use of space, movement, and voice. The class introduces students to a range of acting techniques and styles, encouraging flexible, repeatable choices and an understanding of how different approaches shape character and storytelling.

We are seeking teaching artists for all the following locations: The Milwaukee Youth Arts Center (Downtown Milwaukee), Carroll University (Waukesha), and Concordia University Wisconsin (Mequon).

RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES - THEATER ACADEMY

- Develop, document, and submit age and contextually appropriate lesson plans based on Academy guideposts.
- Work with the Academy Director and other Teaching Artists on a continual basis to develop and facilitate theater curriculum to academy students.
- Maintain a safe learning environment through supporting student well-being, confidence, and personal growth.
- Manage classroom behavior, procedures, and assessments.
- Attend all required meetings and training sessions.
- Facilitate presentations as needed.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Be a team player, lead by example, exhibit a strong work ethic and be committed to the First Stage philosophy of teaching *life skills through stage skills* and *transforming lives through theater*.

- Present excellent communication skills, along with the ability to adjust communications styles to varied youth, parent and professional populations.
- Prior teaching and experience creating curriculum, managing a classroom, and writing lesson plans is required.

- A Bachelor's degree in Education or Theatre Arts is preferred.
