Overview: First Stage Theater Academy seeks a Summer Academy Lead Teaching Artist for a 4 to 8 week contract. As a Lead Teaching Artist you must believe in the mission of First Stage, to transform lives through theater, and work to create a safe, welcoming, inspiring, and motivating environment for students, teachers, and parents. We are seeking a Lead Teaching Artist with expertise in Playmakers (1st-2nd Grade).

Playmakers guides students through process-drama techniques to create individual characters and devise a collaborative story. Using a specified source material, students are guided by a leader to expand upon the existing material and create a new story. Students are challenged to consider choices, consequences, given circumstances, and others perspectives and pursue effective teamwork towards a common goal. Playmakers requires the teacher to strengthen understanding and application of the Actor's Toolbox (voice, body, imagination), be flexible in creating the framework for the drama while allowing students to drive the narrative, and bring an energetic energy to the classroom.

We are seeking teaching artists for all locations: The Milwaukee Youth Arts Center (Downtown Milwaukee), Carroll University (Waukesha), and Concordia University Wisconsin (Mequon).

RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES - THEATER ACADEMY

- Develop, document, and submit age and contextually appropriate lesson plans based on Academy guideposts.
- Work with the K-4 Manager and other Teaching Artists on a continual basis to develop and facilitate theater curriculum to academy students.
- Maintain a safe learning environment through supporting student well-being, confidence, and personal growth.
- Manage classroom behavior, procedures, and assessments.
- Attend all required meetings and training sessions.
- Facilitate presentations as needed.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Be a team player, lead by example, exhibit a strong work ethic and be committed to the First Stage philosophy of teaching *life skills through stage skills* and *transforming lives through theater*.
- Present excellent communication skills, along with the ability to adjust communications styles to varied youth, parent and professional populations.
- Prior teaching and experience creating curriculum, managing a classroom, and writing lesson plans is required.
- Ability to travel to our main campus, Milwaukee Youth Arts Center (325 W Walnut St, Milwaukee, 53212) and/or other satellite locations.
- A Bachelor's degree in Education or Theatre Arts is preferred.
