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SOAR TO NEVERLAND THROUGH DYNAMIC STAGECRAFT IN MAGICAL *PETER PAN & WENDY*

Milwaukee favorites Todd Denning and David Flores headline signature First Stage reimagining

MILWAUKEE, Wis (January 14, 2026) - A magical, movement-driven reimagining of the beloved classic, First Stage's [*Peter Pan and Wendy*](#) transports families to Neverland filled with imagination, courage, and theatrical magic. Running February 20 – March 22 at the Marcus Performing Arts Center's Todd Wehr Theater, this show is perfect for “big kid” audiences 6 and up.

Peter Pan & Wendy transforms J.M. Barrie's timeless tale into a thrilling adventure that captures both the wonder of childhood and the emotional pull of growing up—combining stage magic and physical storytelling to deliver a bold, immersive theatrical experience filled with sword fights, flying, and a giant crocodile puppet.

“*Peter Pan and Wendy* shows First Stage at our very best,” shared Director Jeff Frank, who is joined by Assistant Director Samantha Montgomery and Fight Director Todd Denning. “The journey begins with a black void bursting into life as characters spill onto the stage manipulating scenic elements, puppets, and even the actors themselves to create the magic and wonder of Neverland.”

All performances will feature interactive, hands-on lobby activities starting 30 minutes before showtime. Led by First Stage teaching artists, these family-friendly experiences will include literacy adventures, STEM challenges, and sensory play—all designed to spark creativity and connection.

The production features Todd Denning* as Mr. Darling and Captain Hook, alongside Tori Watson* as Mrs. Darling, J.T. Backes* as Starkey, David Flores as Smee, Sherrick Robinson* as Cecco, and Tim Linn as Mullins. They are joined by 46 young performers in two alternating 23-person casts, continuing First Stage's tradition of youth-focused theater. Young performers take the lead with Marko Van Slyke and Simon Phillips as Peter Pan, and Niamh Mayne and Evie Maassen as Wendy Darling. [Full cast and creative team listed here.](#)
