#### **OVERVIEW:**

The Director of Young Company oversees all elements of the nationally recognized First Stage Young Company - including all program development, hiring and training of teachers, budgeting (in consultation with the Academy Director), producing the full season of Young Company work (two performance projects each season as well as bi-annual new play development), producing and overseeing all trips including the Utah Shakespeare Festival High School competition, creating content and programming for fundraisers including Bard-o-Thon, and serving as a liaison between Academy programs and young performer training. This position also serves as a member of the Artistic Team, providing overall artistic and management support of programming.

- Develop and maintain the Young Company budget in consultation with the Academy Director and with the support of the Academy Manager
- Run day to day operations of the Young Company overseeing auditions, programming, curriculum and staffing - with administrative support from the Academy Manager
