



Inspired by the McCarthy hearings of the 1950s, THE CRUCIBLE took us back to a fictionalized account of the Salem, Massachusetts witch trials. One of the nation's largest high-impact theater training programs for youth, the Theater Academy teaches life skills through stage skills to young people ages 3-18 – offering a challenging curriculum taught by professional teaching artists.

First Stage innovated the Theater Academy by facilitating more than 50% of classes through the virtual platform of Zoom, and maintaining CDC safety protocols for the rest of our classes provided in-person with class sizes reduced by 50%.

Some of our most popular classes included:

VIRTUAL MASTER CLASS SERIES

The series enabled middle/high school students to learn specific theater topics from professional theater artists – including Auditioning, Acting for the Singer, Comedy Writing and Satire, and Puppetry.

PERFORMANCE EXPERIENCE CLASSES

Offered in-person at the Milwaukee Youth Arts Center following CDC protocols, the classes provided students (third grade and up) the opportunity to broaden performance skills and perform a popular show as their final (virtual) presentation in a time when we had less on-stage opportunities for our young performers.

BARD-O-THON

On April 24, 2021, First Stage Theater Academy held its 11th annual, and second virtual, Bard-O-Thon.

In celebration of Shakespeare's birthday, the First Stage Theater Academy challenged members of Young Company to stretch their artistic endurance by performing as many memorized Shakespearean monologues in a row as possible.

Fifty-five Young Company members performed a total of **556** monologues this year. A presentation of some of their work was viewed

in a Facebook Live event, where their incredible depth of understanding was displayed for all to enjoy. As this event is a fundraiser, these students also collected more than \$17,000 in pledges from friends and family to help support Shakespeare programming at First Stage.

total scholarships awarded To ensure the safety of our students and staff during the COVID-19 pandemic, First Stage transitioned all of our Next Steps classes to the online and mobile-friendly platform of Zoom.

Although virtual, our Next Steps classes continued to be taught by professional teaching artists with special education training, and followed our same theater-based curriculum – the exploration of acting, singing, dancing and improvisation, through which students improved their social understanding, fine and gross motor skills, empathy, conversation skills, public speaking and confidence.

First Stage provided the following Next Steps classes:

SUMMER SATURDAYS: These 45-minute classes used classic children's literature as inspiration for creative play and expression.

SUMMER PERFORMANCE EXPERIENCE CLASS: This class met daily from August 17-21, to concentrate their work on DISNEY'S FROZEN, THE MUSICAL. In this show clinic, students worked with theater professionals to broaden their performance skills, deepen their knowledge of theater, and perform a popular show as their final presentation.

SCHOOL YEAR CLASSES: From September 26, 2020 through May 8, 2021, First Stage offered twenty-four, 45-minute classes that explored the Theater Academy curriculum of Acting, Voice and Movement, and Musical Theater.

PRIVATE COACHING SESSIONS: Next Steps students had the opportunity to meet virtually with a First Stage teaching artist weekly or as needed/requested to hone their acting skills in these 30-minute sessions.

Although we were physically apart this past season, First Stage's Next Steps classes remained a place where students were encouraged to take risks and conquer their fears, and actively engage in developing and strengthening their acting skills.

blending the arts with standard curriculum, First Stage Theater in Education programs provide the opportunity for students to learn traditional academic subjects through creativity and self-expression. All of First Stage's programs are directly linked to the Common Core State Standards, Wisconsin's Model Academic Standards, 21st Century Learning Skills, and ReadyGen Standards.

SCHOOL MEMBERSHIPS

Thanks to the support from the community, 70 schools were given unlimited access to our incredible library of pre-recorded workshops during the school year through our new School Membership Package—which included the following residencies:

EARLY LITERACY PROGRAM (GRADES K-3): These 20 to 30-minute workshops utilized picture books to engage students in drama-based activities while reinforcing their understanding of fundamental language comprehension skills. Each story was divided into two chapters, ending with prompts meant to encourage creative thinking, problem solving, and making personal connections.

INTRO TO ACTING RESIDENCY (GRADES 4-8): These 15-minute workshops introduced students to the basic building blocks of theater, and helped students develop their actor tools of body, voice, and imagination. Students dove into the story of THE LION KING, as they explored a key element of the drama process each session, and were encouraged to actively participate along with the teaching artists. Sessions concluded with a prompt meant to help students put into practice the skills they just learned, and included group activities for the class to engage in together.

ARTS INTEGRATED WORKSHOPS (GRADES 5-9): These 30 to 50-minute workshops used dramatic activities to teach lessons throughout the elementary and middle school curricula, and were directly linked to the Common Core State Standards and the National Core Arts Standards in Theatre. Each workshop was divided into smaller chapters, ending with prompts that teachers could use to assess for understanding. For example: After actively exploring Ruby Bridges' story, students are asked to create a storyboard sequencing key moments in her story to deepen their understanding of how Ruby's strength and courage influenced a nation.

All workshops also included supplementary materials and extensions for educators to utilize.

EVALUATION RESULTS

72% of educators felt that the virtual workshops strongly connected to the related key academic standards.

72% of educators felt that the virtual workshops supported the standard based skills they were teaching their students.

56% of educators observed their students being actively engaged in the virtual workshop sessions.

52% of educators reported that they used some, if not all, of the supplemental materials First Stage made available to support further learning of the workshops' key academic standards.

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




